## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

April Showers, April Madness, Yard work and Springtime herald the seasons new beginnings and renewal. Snow Birds will soon begin their annual migration and disperse until fall. For those staying and keeping the lights on there are a few projects to complete this summer.

Club House repair of the flat roof along with fascia and gutters and the guard house repairs. These are our remaining CapX projects for 2019. In early July your BOD will be submitting our 2020 Capx requests to the park owners. Consideration, approval, and budgeting will be completed by January 2020 and announced by ELS. 360 inspections by park management are underway and will be completed soon.

The Garden Club has hit the ground running with their Park beautification projects. The Park entrance sign has a raised garden with plants now and the Front Circle has been cleaned and has fresh plantings. FMO president Jerry Durham issued an email on March 19 announcing the removal of proposed HB 1023 and SB 1262 legislation from consideration. This proposed legislation crafted by FMO and FMHA has created much controversy and was in short, not resident friendly. The drafts and commentary are on our website [www.lakelandharborhomeowners.org](http://www.lakelandharborhomeowners.org). Your BOD and organizations such as Networking for Progress, Lakeland Inter-park Council and FMO are our watchdogs, watching and protecting us homeowners.

Entering the summer months there is a very important process starting and culminating with the elections in November. It is the announcement and nominating of candidates seeking a position on the Board of Directors. This year 5 positions will be opening. Please take a moment and consider a position on the Board. If you have a desire to serve the residents of Lakeland Harbor through the Homeowners association and be our representative to Park management, protecting the interest of all our residents and neighbors, please consider volunteering your service. There will be announcements in the Harbor Light and on the Website and Facebook.

Our last Board meeting before the summer break will be April 11, 2019 and I promise I won't forget the cookies.

## NOTE FROM THE MANAGER

April showers bring May flowers and Spring is in the air! I do miss the “season” changes up north with Spring and Fall being my favorite. I’m approaching my 3rd full summer here in Florida and have noticed nature’s changes the past few months. The trees are definitely a bit greener and I have been sneezing a bit more too!



I have started 360 Inspections. Notices of the first phase of inspections were delivered on March 4th to homes that got inspected. Of the 300+ inspections completed, more than half had violations to power wash or clean gutters. I anticipate to have all homes inspected by the end of April.

Progress continues to be made on projects that have been long overdue to be completed. Did you notice the gatehouse has been completed? The termite infested walls were replaced and the damage to the exterior done by hurricane Irma has been repaired with new vinyl siding. We are still moving in the right direction with the new entrance signs. The signs are in production. There was a bit of a stall with information needed to acquire permits. As of this writing, the information has been provided to the contractor. Once the permits are obtained I believe we will get across that finish line really soon and have two new beautiful signs installed. I promise you these signs will be well worth the wait.

Our snowbirds will be heading back north soon. Please stop by the office to let us know you are leaving so we can be sure

we have all of your correct information on file. Please be sure you have arrangements with someone to maintain your home while you are away.



A final reminder.... April is here which means the prospectus change goes into effect. Your rent is due on the 1st of each month. The grace period is now changed to the 5th of the month instead of the 10th. Any rent not received by the 5th will incur late fees of 10% of the balance due on your account.

## TIPS FOR "SEASONAL" RESIDENTS

During April, May, and June, some of our friends begin to pack up their belongings and prepare for their trips back to their homes in the northern U.S. But before you hop on that plane, make sure you go through the appropriate steps to close your Florida home.

Many things can happen when you close up and leave your home for an extended period of time. The warmth and humidity of our Sunshine State leads to mold, mildew, rust, and unpleasant odors, and those are just your likely problems. Water leaks, strong winds, are just some of the things that may present some interesting problems with which to deal upon your return. Don't come home to a troublesome situation; take these steps to ensure a happy homecoming.

- Clean out your refrigerator
- Run water in all faucets for 10 minutes to flush system, then put olive oil (about one capful) in trap to seal in moisture
- Turn off the water
- Unplug the hot water heater/Turn off the breaker
- Set the air conditioner at 78 degrees and the dehumidifier at 45 (if you have a dehumidifier)
- Open all of the interior doors to circulate air throughout the home
- Close all of the curtains and blinds to keep the heat out
- Install surge protectors throughout your home
- Unplug all audio/visual components, including the phone and cable lines
- Clean out gutters and drainage
- Schedule pest control services
- Bring in lanai furniture
- Stop newspaper deliveries until your return
- Forward your mail to your off-season home
- Temporarily discontinue phone, internet, and cable services.
- Have someone check on your home and let you know if any issues arise that need your attention

## NOTES FOR ALL RESIDENTS

We would like to ask residents to think twice be-

fore throwing food out in your yards to feed the wild life. This encourages animals to hang around your (or your neighbor's) yard hunting for food. There can be problems keeping these animals from imposing damages around or underneath your home.

### Free Directory Service for Cells

Cell phone companies are charging us \$1.00 to \$1.75 or more for 411 information calls when they don't have to. Most of us do not carry a telephone directory in our vehicle, which makes this situation even more of a problem. When you need to use the 411 information option, simply dial (800)FREE411, or (800) 373-3411 without incurring any charge at all. Program this into your cell phone now.

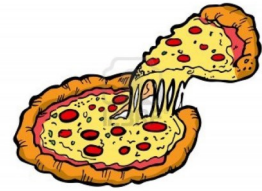

**Recipe of the Month**

In a small bowl, beat cream cheese and mustard until smooth. Stir in the Swiss cheese, Ham, ¼ C chives. Spread 1T. mixture over each bread slice; place on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees 12 -15 minutes or until lightly browned. Sprinkle with remaining chives. Yield: 1 ½ dozen

## The Federation of Manufactured/Mobile Homeowners

### MOST CURRENT UPDATE FROM FMO

Florida Federation of Manufactured Homeowners announces that House Bill 1023 and Senate Bill 1262 filed as amendments to improve Florida Chapter 723 have been **removed from 2019 legislation consideration. This was agreed to by FMO, FMHA and Legislation Sponsors.**

Florida FMO President, Jerry Durham, thanked opponents to the amendments for their well articulated arguments. The Networking for Progress group, including our LHHA Directors and our District 1 FMO supported many of the changes but voiced great concerns about clauses too open to abuse in enforcement. This included who defines a violation and the time frame. Jerry Durham's letter is posted on the Lakeland Harbor FMO bulletin board.

The Board of FMO will continue to focus on the mission we all volunteered for, to protect and enhance manufactured home life style, via the implementation of the five year plan adopted at the state assembly. The principles of the plan include communication, education and inclusion. The Florida FMO Board will continue to address homeowners' issues.

www.FMO website now features the bi-monthly newsletter and is sent to members' email address in March. The paper copy will continue and choices are coming.
