With the unpredictable hurricane season here in Florida, it is imperative that the office be able to contact you. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT!!!!

I want to make you aware of two bills that were recently introduced in the Florida Senate and the Florida House of Representatives. These bills, if passed, will have an impact on how owners of manufactured home parks deal with HOAs. I encourage you to take some time and make yourself aware of these bills. ## TIPS FOR "SEASONAL" RESIDENTS

During April, May, and June, some of our friends begin to pack up their belongings and prepare for their trips back to their homes in the northern U.S. But before you get in that car or hop on that plane, make sure you go through the appropriate steps to close your Florida home.

Many things can happen when you close up and leave your home for an extended period of time. The warmth and humidity of our Sunshine State leads to mold, mildew, rust, and unpleasant odors, and those are just your likely problems. Water leaks, strong winds, are just some of the things that may present some interesting problems with which to deal upon your return. Don't come home to a troublesome situation; take these steps to ensure a happy homecoming.

- Clean out your refrigerator
- Run water in all faucets for 10 minutes to flush system, then put olive oil (about one capful) in trap to seal in moisture
- Turn off the water
- Unplug the hot water heater/Turn off the breaker
- Set the air conditioner at 78 degrees and the dehumidifier at 45 (if you have a dehumidifier)
- Open all of the interior doors to circulate air throughout the home
- Close all of the curtains and blinds to keep the heat out
- Install surge protectors throughout your home
- Unplug all audio/visual components, including the phone and cable lines
- Clean out gutters and drainage
- Schedule pest control services
- Bring in lanai furniture
- Stop newspaper deliveries until your return
- Forward your mail to your off-season home
- Temporarily discontinue phone, internet, and cable services.
- Have someone check on your home and let you know if any issues arise that need your attention

## NOTES FOR ALL RESIDENTS

We would like to ask residents to think twice before throwing food out in your yards to feed the wild life. This encourages animals to hang around your (or your neighbor's) yard hunting for food. There can be problems keeping these animals from imposing damages around or underneath your home. Not to mention, but the fact is that feeding some of the local animals is actually against the law in Florida

**GREAT NEWS... Lakeland Harbor and Florida M/M HOMEOWNERS**

Reference: FMO Watchdog News 3/13/23. SEE FMO.ORG, POLITICAL ADVOCACY COMMITTEE.

**BILLS PROPOSED BY FMO TO IMPROVE CHAPTER 723 ARE FILED, HOUSE (HB 751, Paula Stark) AND SENATE SPONSORS (SB 1378 Ed Hooper).** LINE ITEMS IN QUESTION i.e., OWNER 15 DAY APPROVAL PROCESS NEGOTIATED IN COMMITTEE.

SENATOR ED HOOPER, PALM HARBOR, SPONSORED AND FILED SENATE BILL 1378, WHICH HAS BEEN REFERRED TO THE FOLLOWING COMMITTEES: REGULATED INDUSTRIES, JUDICIARY AND FISCAL POLICY.

HOMEOWNERS NEED TO ACT BY *CONTACTING COMMITTEE HOUSE AND SENATE FI. LEGISLATORS* TO INCREASE AWARENESS OF GREAT NUMBER OF HOMEOWNERS IN FAVOR OF CHANGES IN THESE BILLS:

- ELIMINATING THE SALES TAX ON RE-SALES OF M/M HOMES
- THE DIRECT INTERVENTION BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL RELATING TO PARK OWNER AND MOBILE HOMEOWNER IN DETERMINATION OF UNRESASONABLE LOT RENTAL INCREASES AS WELL AS MEDIATION PROCESSES
- CLARIFIES THAT PARK OWNER MUST MAINTAIN LOTS IN GOOD ORDER
- CHANGES ARE NEEDED DUE TO THE UNEQUAL BARGAINING POSITION BETWEEN WEALTHY PARK OWNERS AND M/M HOMEOWNERS

Suggestions and Actions that have been successfully used by homeowners (as the savers of KEEPING the cap on rent increases well know):

Click on Find your Legislators to see Tallahassee phone number, address and contact EMAIL! Use same process to see **Lakeland area Representatives or Senators. ALSO FMO.ORG**

House and Senate staff answer/note telephone calls (even by machine) and log volume of support calls. Phone calls and emails WORK. It is vital to state "I am calling as a **Florida m/m homeowner and \_\_\_\_\_** any or all that apply,) widow of a veteran, veteran, pensioner, disabled, voter.

Please request members of committee **to support SB 1378** or HB 751 Mention the **unequal** bargaining positions of homeowners and Park owner or any of items stated above. Senator Hooper continues to strongly support M/M homeowners by filing this Bill and IS VICE CHAIR. It is also appropriate to state thanks to him for support and filing!

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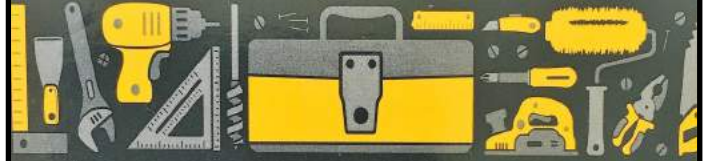

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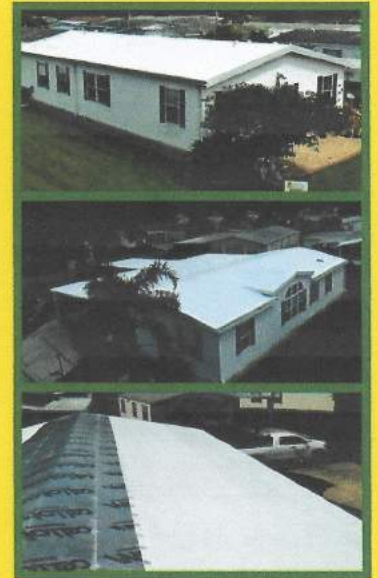
